Look at the tare weight that is stamped on the collar/handle of the propane tank. That is the only truly precise measurement of that specific tank's empty weight. If you put a propane tank on a scale and the reading matches the tare weight stamped on the collar/handle, then the tank is definitely empty. Is it safe to refill small propane bottles?
Summary: The U.S. Department of Transportation, cautions the public to never refill DOT 39 cylinders, such as the 1lb. cylinders used for camping. These types of containers were not designed to withstand the stresses of emptying and refilling. Is it OK to leave propane tank outside in winter?
