Hgar also appeared in print ads for IBM's RISC System/6000 desktop workstation. His animated TV special, "Hgar Knows Best," aired on CBS in 1989 and explored the culture shock of returning home after two years of battles. The special showcased Hgar's struggles as a father, particularly with his daughter Honi dating a minstrel named Lute instead of Olaf. In recent years, Hgar has gained renewed popularity, with Abandon Pictures acquiring the film rights for a CGI animated series co-produced by King Features and The Jim Henson Company. The new series is currently in production and will be animated by Henson Digital Puppetry Studio. Hgar has also appeared in video games, including a scrolling platform game released for the Amiga in 1991. Several paperbacks featuring the comic strip have been published by various companies, showcasing Hgar's adventures as a Viking leader.
