The Call Waiting feature on iPhone is designed to inform you about incoming calls, while you are busy and tied up with an ongoing call on your iPhone. This allows you to respond to important business or personal calls, either by switching immediately to the waiting call or by ending the ongoing call and getting in touch with the Caller. However, the Call Waiting feature can be a nuisance, especially, if you are busy with an important call and do not want to be distracted by your device alerting you about other incoming calls. Note: The Call Waiting feature will only be available on iPhone, if this feature is supported by your mobile service provider.

1. Enable Call Waiting on iPhone if the Call Waiting feature is supported by your Mobile Service Provider, you can follow the steps below to enable the Call Waiting feature on your iPhone.

1. Open Settings > Go to Phone > Call Waiting.

2. On the Call Waiting screen, move the toggle next to Call Waiting to ON position. This will enable the Call Waiting feature on your iPhone.

2. Disable Call Waiting on iPhone if you do not want to be distracted an incoming call waiting on your device, you can switch-off or disable the Call Waiting feature on your iPhone by following the steps below.

1. Go to Settings > Phone > Call Waiting.

2. On the next screen, move the toggle next to Call Waiting to OFF position. After this, your iPhone will no longer beep or prompt you about other people calling, while you are busy in an important conversation.

Note: When Call Waiting is disabled, calls that you are unable to attend will get automatically diverted to the Voice Mail on your iPhone. When call waiting is turned on, you can answer a new call without ending your ongoing call.

Press Settings. Press Phone. Press Call Waiting. Press the indicator next to 'Call Waiting' to turn the function on or off. Slide your finger upwards starting from the bottom of the screen to return to the home screen.

Slide 1 is active iPhone provides the option to Forward Calls to another number, if the Call Forwarding feature is supported by your mobile service provider and included in your phone plan. However, you need to be aware that certain service providers are known to charge an extra fee for this service. Hence, it is recommended that you check with your service provider, before adding a call forwarding number to your device. Also, make sure that you remember to disable call forwarding on your iPhone, as soon as you are done with the reason for forwarding calls to another number.

Forgetting to disable call forwarding can result in your calls getting diverted to the other number, while you are expecting them to come to your iPhone.

Steps to Forward Calls on iPhone to Another Phone Number

Follow the steps below to forward calls on iPhone to another phone number.

1. Go to Settings > Phone > scroll down to Calls section and tap on Call Forwarding.

2. On Call Forwarding screen, move the toggle next to Call Forwarding to ON position and tap on Forward To option that appears.

3. On the next screen, type the Phone Number (starting with Area Code) to which you want to forward your Calls to.

4. After you are done typing the Phone Number, tap on the Back arrow to save the changes.

Once Call Forwarding has been enabled on your device, you will see a Phone icon with an arrow in the status bar on your iPhone. This will provide a good indication that your iPhone is currently set to forward calls to another number.

How to Disable Call Forwarding on iPhone

Disabling Call forwarding on an iPhone is just as easy as enabling this feature.

1. Go to Settings > Phone > Call Forwarding.

2. On the Call Forwarding screen, move the toggle next to Call Forwarding to OFF position.

Once Call Forwarding is disabled, the phone icon with arrow will disappear from the status bar and your iPhone will start accepting phone calls and ring as usual.

Enable Call Forwarding on Carrier Locked iPhones

If you are unable to access the Call Forwarding feature on the Settings screen on your iPhone, it is likely that this feature has been blocked by your Carrier. In such cases, you might be able to Forward Calls to another number using an alternative method as reported by some users.

1. Dial *72 followed by the Phone Number that you want to forward the Calls to.

2. To Disable Call Forwarding, simply Dial *73 at any time. This will disable Call Forwarding and you will be able to receive Calls on your iPhone.

It can do all kinds of wonderful tasks simultaneously. For example, you probably already know that it will alert you if you have a call coming in while you are already on another call. Your iPhone springs into action and displays the person's name or number, as well as three options: Decline Incoming Call, Answer & Hold Current Call, and Answer & End Current Call. This is part of the call waiting feature on your iPhone, and it's great if you're expecting an important call or if you want to add the caller to a conference call that you've set up. However, the rest of the time you might just find it annoying and intrusive (and anyone you put on hold or hang up on to take the new call probably finds it rude and insulting). In that case, you can turn off call waiting by following these steps: On the Home screen, tap Settings. The Settings app appears. Tap Phone. The Phone screen appears. Tap Call Waiting. The Call Waiting screen appears. Tap the Call Waiting switch to Off. Your iPhone disables call waiting. While the Call blocking feature on iPhone is useful for dealing with spam and nuisance calls, it can also be used in a variety of other situations in our day-to-day life. For example, two individuals may have a serious fall out in their relationship, leading one of them to block the other's Phone Number. Similarly, it is also possible for the Call Blocking feature on iPhone to be used unfairly. For example, someone who owes you money or a favor might end up blocking your phone number in order to avoid your calls. Hence, we are providing below the steps to bypass the Call blocking feature on iPhone and contact the other party, if it becomes necessary to do so.

Caution: Before Calling Someone Who Has Blocked Your Number

Before going ahead with the steps to call someone that has blocked your number, you need to be aware that unnecessarily calling someone that has blocked your phone number can get you in trouble. Hence, the steps to call someone that has blocked your number on iPhone are only to be used in case of an emergency and in genuine situations where it has become necessary to call a person even though he/she has blocked your number. Please make sure that you respect the privacy of others and do not use these steps to harass, bother or spam anyone with unwanted calls.

Steps to Call Someone Who has Blocked Your Number

On iPhone

Follow the steps below to call someone that has blocked your phone number on iPhone.

1. Go to Settings > Phone > scroll down and tap on Show My Caller ID tab located under Calls section.

2. On the next screen, disable Caller ID by moving Show My Caller ID toggle to OFF position.

After disabling Caller ID, make a Call to the person that has blocked your Phone Number and this time your Call will go through. As mentioned earlier, the iPhone of the person that has blocked your Phone Number won't be able to figure out who is calling (As your Caller ID is hidden) and will allow the Call to pass through. After this point, everything depends on how your Contact responds to Calls from Unknown Callers.

1. It is possible that your Contact might answer the call out of curiosity, providing you with an opportunity to explain the situation and convey your message.

2. It is also possible that your Contact might ignore the call, because it is appearing to come from an unknown caller. If your Contact appears not to answer calls from unknown numbers, try calling this person using another phone number. This might make your Contact answer the Call (Since the Phone Number is visible this time).
