Overview:The State Office of Vital Records provides certified copies of marriage applications, certificates and verifications.A marriage application and/or certificate is an official recording of a couples marriage. It is used for:Serving as evidence of a name change for the involved partiesLegitimation purposesGenealogical researchDivorce proceedingsMarriage Applications and Certificates:These records are available at the State Office of Vital Records fromJune 1952 to August 1996.Marriage records outside this time are available at the county Probate Office in the county the marriage license was issued.(Please note: A certified copy of the marriage application is only available to the Bride/Party 1 and Groom/Party 2) Requestor Search of Marriage Form Marriage Verifications.If you are not sure of the county in which the marriage occurred or need this information for genealogical purposes, please consider requesting a marriage verification by filling out the form below. Page last updated 1/9/2025 You can apply for a marriage license at the probate court. It's typically located at the county courthouse. Some high population counties (400,000+) have extra satellite courthouses available. Note: Your application will be processed by the probate court clerk, deputy, or judge. Costs How much does the marriage license cost? A Georgia marriage license costs between \$56 and \$82, depending on the county. How does my residency factor into applying? Are you or your fianc a Georgia resident? If either you or your fianc is a Georgia resident, you may apply for a marriage license at any Georgia probate court. Are both you and your fianc nonresidents of Georgia? If neither you nor your fianc is a Georgia resident, apply for a marriage license in the county where the marriage ceremony will take place. Usage Where can I use my marriage license? If you or your fianc is a Georgia resident, you can marry anywhere in the state. Otherwise, apply and marry in the county where the ceremony will occur. Application What information do I have to provide on the application? The marriage license application will ask for your current name, new last name after marriage, residence, date and place of birth, social security number, marital history, along with your parents' names, residences, and dates and places of birth. Attendance What if I can't apply in person? You must apply together, in person. Georgia does not offer the ability to submit an absentee marriage license application. Age Requirements How old must I be to marry? Aged 18 and over? If you're 18 years old or over, parental consent to marry is unnecessary. Aged 16 and 17? If you're 16 or 17 years old, you can marry with the consent of your custodial parents or guardian. Consent is either granted face-to-face with the probate court judge or by affidavit. Aged 15 and below? Minors below the age of 16 are not allowed to marry. Premarital Education What's to gain by taking a premarital education course? Your marriage license fee will be reduced by \$40 if you and your fianc present a 6-hour premarital education course certificate of completion, signed by an authorized instructor within the past year. Waiting Period When will my marriage license be issued? Your marriage license will be issued immediately and can be used right away. Expiration How long will my marriage license last? Your marriage license will expire 60 days after it's been issued. Identification What ID must I bring? Bring ID to confirm your age, such as a driver's license, state-issued ID card, military ID card, passport, birth certificate, immigration papers, or citizenship papers. Note: Documents not written in English must be accompanied by a certified and notarized English translation. Blood Test Do I have to get a blood test? You're not required to get a blood test before marriage. However, you'll be given brochures on AIDS and sickle cell disease that recommend getting tested. Divorced What if I've been divorced? There's a high likelihood you'll be asked to show a certified copy of your divorce decree from every prior divorce. Widowed What if I'm a widow or widower? Depending on the probate court, you may be asked to produce an obituary notice or certified copy of the death certificate for your late spouse. Witnesses Do I have to bring witnesses? You do not have to bring witnesses to your marriage ceremony. Name Change How do I change my name after marriage? Your marriage certificate can be used to change your name with government institutions based on the new name you specify on the application. You can use a marriage name change service to prepare the forms before or after your marriage ceremony. License Return When must my license be returned? Your marriage license must be returned to the probate court judge to be recorded no later than 30 days after your marriage ceremony. Marriage Certificate How do I get a copy of my marriage certificate? You can purchase a certified copy of your marriage certificate for roughly \$10 from the probate court that issued and recorded your marriage license. Common-law Marriage Can I establish a common-law marriage? Georgia will only recognize a common-law marriage established before January 1, 1997. Cousin Marriage Am I allowed to marry my cousin? You can marry your first cousin, but no family relationship closer than that. Proxy Marriage Can I get married by proxy? You cannot get married by proxy in Georgia. Civil Ceremony Where can I get married in a civil ceremony? You can request the probate court judge preside over your civil ceremony. The fee is usually minor and sometimes even free. If you can't be scheduled in a timely manner due to lack of available appointments, you may be referred to a magistrate court. Marriage licenses are issued by county probate courts and require applicants to be at least 18 years old, of sound mind, and have no living spouse from a prior un-dissolved marriage. If both individuals are 17 years old, they must complete premarital education. Georgia residents can apply for a marriage license in any county in Georgia, but non-residents must obtain the license in the county where the ceremony will take place. To obtain a marriage license, applicants must complete an online application before appearing in person. The process requires a three-step process: completing the online application with the Fillable Form, submitting the application, and completing the marriage license. The cost of the marriage license is \$76, and applicants can begin the application process online at for faster in-office application time.Marriage licenses in Georgia have varying prices depending on the county, but generally cost around \$50-60. To decrease the cost of the application, applicants can take a six-hour premarital education program. Marriage license applications are processed on a walk-in basis only, and once married, the original license must be returned to the Probate Court personally or by U.S. Mail.In Georgia, there is no waiting period for couples who want to get married. A couple can obtain a marriage license anywhere in Georgia if one of the prospective spouses lives there. If neither prospective spouse lives in Georgia, the license must be issued in the county where the ceremony will take place.To get married online in Georgia, applicants must ensure eligibility, complete the online application, and visit the office to complete the process. They must bring a valid ID and the cost of the license, which is \$56 or more. The marriage license and marriage report forms can be typed or printed neatly in black ink. These forms must be neat and legible. Turn in both forms to the Probate Court. The marriage license is issued at the time of the application. The Probate Court takes about 10-30 minutes to process applications. Once the license is issued, you can get married right away. The marriage license lets the officiant perform the ceremony. The marriage certificate proves you are married. We will ask you to provide a permanent address for the marriage certificate to be mailed after your marriage information is recorded. Walk-in applicants will be given the online link to make an appointment at a later time. Marriage License Applications require a three-step process: You must complete your application online with the Fillable Form and submit the application. Marriage License Application Follow this link to schedule an appointment when both applicants come to court for your license and to pay the fees. Note: Please do not schedule your appointment until you have completed and submitted the application, have all necessary documents, and current IDs. Click Here to Schedule Licensing Appointment When you arrive at the Probate Court for your appointment, you MUST have submitted your marriage license application and have all necessary supporting documents. Necessary supporting documents include, but are not limited to, both applicants' current driver's licenses or passports, signed or sealed judgment of divorce, the last marriage or death certificate for last former spouse. Having all necessary supporting documents will minimize your time at the Probate Court, but you are still required to have the appropriate identification and requirements as listed on this website. The application process takes about 20-30 minutes. The applicants receive the license the day they apply. The applicants must take the license to the person performing the ceremony. If you do not have an Officiate selected, a list can be provided upon request during the application process. The person performing the ceremony will then sign the license and return it to the court. The court will issue a certified copy of the marriage license and application to the applicants. The applicants will use the certified copy of the marriage license and certified copy of the application to change their name on Social Security cards, Drivers licenses, and other legal documents. To make application for a marriage license, both parties must appear in person at 735 James Brown Blvd., Suite 1000 between the hours of 8:30 am - 4:30 pm, Monday - Friday. Applicants can begin the Application process online at for a faster in-office application time. The cost of the marriage license is \$76, CASH ONLY. If the applicants have completed six hours of premarital counseling together, by a minister or licensed marriage counselor, and have a certificate of completion stating the required amount of hours completed within the last 12 months, the cost for the marriage license is \$36, CASH ONLY. In order to get additional copies of the marriage license, applicants can come into the court or request a copy by mail. If you are planning a wedding in Georgia, you may want to consider getting a marriage license in Georgia. A marriage license is a legal document that allows a couple to get married. It is issued by the probate court in the county where the ceremony is to be performed. The license does not have an expiration date. Both parties must be present in the office with your current identification to obtain a marriage license. If you're thinking about tying the knot in Georgia, as in any state, you'll need to do a bit of planning ahead of time. One of the items on your checklist? Getting a marriage license. In order for the government to legally recognize your union, you'll need this legal document (especially for taxes and insurance). Since you and your partner will both need to appear in person at a specific bureau to obtain your license, if you dont currently reside there, youll have to schedule a trip to get this necessary wedding detail squared away. For help navigating this process with ease, we turned to Melinda Guess, a Georgia wedding officiant who has plenty of experience guiding her couples as they obtain their licenses.Wondering how to get married in Georgia? Below, read up on everything youll need to know to get your Georgia marriage license. If either you or your spouse (or both of you) are residents of Georgia, you can apply for a marriage license in any county in the state, regardless of where your wedding is taking place. However, if neither of you is a resident and you're traveling to Georgia for your nuptials, you must apply for your marriage license in the county where your ceremony will occur. The application process usually takes place inside the county's probate court. For instance, in Fulton County, where Atlanta is located, you can apply at one of three probate courts, which are open from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. and welcome walk-ins (although, there may be a wait time of up to two hours, Guess notes). In some counties, such as Chatham County (where Savannah is) or Clayton County (a more rural part of the state), you may have to file a request online before you secure an in-person appointment to sign the forms. Check the county you're applying in for their specific requirements. Since there is no expiration date for Georgia marriage licenses, you can acquire your license as far in advance as you'd like. In the state of Georgia, marriage licenses dont expire, so I encourage my couples to go as early as possible to check it off the list, Guess says. Without any waiting period, you can tie the knot immediately after you receive your form. In most counties, you'll receive your license the same day you apply, but to be on the safe side, it's best to plan ahead of time. There are a few items you'll need to bring to your in-person appointment in order to get a marriage license in Georgia.Proof of Age: Since you must be at least 18 years old to get married in Georgia, you'll have to prove your age. To do so, provide one of the following documents: your birth certificate, drivers license, baptismal certificate, passport, immigration papers, hospital admission card with the full name and date of birth, etc.Proof of Divorce or Death: If one of you has been divorced in the past, you'll need to know the date your divorce was finalized. If your divorce happened close to the day you're applying for your licensewithin 30 days or lessyou're required to present a copy of the divorce decree. If either party is widowed, make sure to bring a copy of the death certificate or obituary.Money: In Georgia, marriage licenses cost approximately \$68. You may also have to pay additional fees, depending on where you're applying. You can pay in cash (but no bills larger than \$20), money order, or credit card. To reduce the price to \$16, you'll need to provide a certificate, saying you completed a state-approved premarital education program. After you receive your Georgia marriage license, be sure to bring it with you to the ceremony. Before you trade vows, your officiant will examine the document. Then, after you say I do, the individual presiding over your service will complete the forms and sign it. Note that for Georgia weddings, witnesses arent mandatory, so you wont need additional people to sign on the dotted line. Within 30 days after your big day, your officiant will return your marriage license to the probate court. Once the court processes the licensewhich can take up to 30 dayshe'll send you the marriage certificate, which proves that youre legally married.
