## Operation chaos floppy disk code and password answers

Hi all, this is a quick guide on how to decrypt the floppy disk for the Operation Chaos side mission in Call of Duty: Black Ops Cold War. It seems the code to crack the floppy disk is different for all users, but by following this guide you'll crack it in no time. Acquire the Evidence The first step to decrypting the floppy disk is to finding all the evidence. You need to find three pieces: Front Page of the Observer (found in the retro bar in the mission "Redlight, Greenlight"), A Coded Message (found after talking with Qasim in the first mission or two in the game), and Numbers Station Broadcast (found in the mission "Brick in the Wall"). Finding the Passphrase The next step is to find the passphrase. Open the coded message and you'll see a bunch of numbers appear in some of the squares in both red and blue. You'll need to find the pattern in order to figure out what your missing numbers from your sequence is. To find your missing numbers, split it into red numbers and blue numbers. Find the missing number in the red set first, then the blue set. My sequence was 68 66 70 71 74 76 ? ? 88 86. In my sequence, my red numbers increase by +\*2 (where x is that number's position in the sequence after the first number), 68 + 2 = 70, 70 + 4 = 74, 74 + 6 = 80 (my missing red number), 80 + 8 = 88. My blue numbers were just increasing by 5 each time: 66 + 5 = 71, 71 + 5 = 76, 76 + 5 = 81 (my missing blue number), 81 + 5 = 86). After this, you will have your missing numbers. Listed to the Numbers Station Broadcast and match them up to one of the cities. The name of the city is your passphrase. Mine was 80 81, which equated to "Charleston". This makes "charleston" my passphrase. Finding the Code The last step is to find the code. Inspect the newspaper and you'll notice some of the letters in the headline turn red. Write them down and unscramble them to match the name of a city (a list of these is within the Numbers Station Broadcast). Once you find the city, find its corresponding code from the Numbers Station Broadcast. This is the code you need. My highlighted letters, unscrambled, gave me "Portland", which had a code of 84 90. This means 8490 is my code. This article is over 4 years old and may contain outdated information Call of Duty: Black Ops Cold War has a few side missions you can do in between main story missions, and Operation Chaos is one of them. This mission tasks you with taking down an ex-CIA operative and his burgeoning spy ring, but you can't get the information you need about the spy ring without decrypting a floppy disk that contains crucial secrets. This floppy disk has a tough code to crack, but you can solve it with the right evidence. Here's how to decrypt the floppy disk for Operation Chaos in Call of Duty: Black Ops Cold War. What Evidence Do You Need for Operation Chaos? You need the following evidence to successfully decrypt the floppy disk for Operation Chaos. Front Page of the Observer (Redlight, Greenlight) A Coded Message (Capture Qasim Javadia in first mission Nowhere to Run) Numbers Station Broadcast (Brick in the Wall) If you've missed any of the evidence listed above, replay the listed mission and locate the evidence. Once you have all three, it's time to solve the puzzle. How to Decrypt the Floppy Disk To begin solving the puzzle, examine A Coded Message. Some numbers will appear and leave two question marks that you need to fill in. The red numbers and blue numbers follow a set pattern, and you have to use this pattern to deduce what the missing numbers are. Everyone has different numbers and patterns, so you will need to do some math on your end. In my case, the red numbers added 6 every time, moving from 28 to 34 to 40 and so on. The blue numbers increased by a larger number each time, adding 1 to the first number, 2 to the second number, 3 to the third number, and so on. Keep in mind, the patterns and numbers will be slightly different on your end. Once you've deduced the missing numbers, put them together to create a four-digit sequence. With that four-digit code in hand, examine the Numbers Station Broadcast. Find which city corresponds with your numbers. This is the passphrase the computer will ask you for later. Next, examine the Front Page of the Observer. The headline will have a random group of letters highlighted in red. This is actually a scrambled word that will give you your next clue. Examine the Numbers Station Broadcast next. There is a list of locations, and the jumbled red letters on the Front Page of the Observer can be rearranged into the name of one of these places. For example, if the letters INTUSA are highlighted in red, they can be rearranged to say Austin. Every player has a different location name, so you have to do the detective work on your own. After unscrambling the name of the city, examine the Numbers Station Broadcast once more. This time, find the four numbers that correspond to whatever city name you have. These four digits are the code the computer will ask you for. Once you have both puzzles solved, it's time to Decrypt the Floppy Disk. Select "Decrypt Floppy Disk" and input the code and passphrase you got from the puzzles above. If done correctly, you will crack the code and get the information you need for Operation Chaos. COD Cold Decrypt War Floppy Disk - Operation ChaosCOD Cold War Operation ChaosBefore you want decrypt a floppy disk, you have to collect three pieces of evidence:A Coded Message - During the first mission Nowhere to Run, if you don't throw Qasim Javadia over the edge, you'll automatically obtain the first piece of evidence. It reads as follows: "We discovered Qasim carrying this coded message. We believe it is intended for the U.S. spy ring, but no one's been able to decrypt it yet."Numbers Station Broadcast - You can't miss this audio reel during the mission Brick in the Wall, since it is marked as evidence for Operation Chaos. "You did good finding this reel in that Russian base. It looks like a number station broadcast intended for the spy ring. Give it a listen and see if anything clicks."Front Page of the Observer - You'll find the third evidence piece during Redlight, Greenlight mission, in a bar. "Sometimes the Reds hide coded messages in plain sight. The CIA didn't invest years of cryptography training into you for nothing."COD Cold War Decrypt floppy diskWhen you investigate the front page of the Observer evidence some letters will be highlighted in red. Wright them down. It's an anagram that you should rearrange and get a location name in Numbers Station Broadcast evidence. For example, my scrambled highlighted word was SBOTNO and it can be rearranged into BOSTON. Once you find the name of the city, write down the numbers next to it. This number is the code that the computer will ask from you. Don't forget that red letters are random for each player and you should solve this anagram on your own.Another part of the riddle is A Coded message, where some red and blue numbers will appear and two question marks between them. Your goal is to find a pattern for red numbers, and a different pattern for blue numbers. Once you figure out the pattern you can fill in the question mark spots with correct answers. Every player will get different numbers and pattern to solve. In my case for red numbers the solution was to add number 5 every time. So my red question mark solution was number 14.It was a little trickier to solve blue number pattern. My blue numbers were 7, 15, 21, 7, 27. As you can see, you'll get the second number by adding 8 to the first one. You get the third number by adding 6 to the second one. My reasoning is that to get the fourth number I have to add 4 to the third number. This all fit in nicely because adding 2 to the fourth number results in 27, which is the correct 5th number. This means that the solution to my particular blue number puzzle was 25. This makes the number solutions to the puzzle I got as 14 and 25.Once you solve the puzzle and find the missing numbers, put them together to create a four-digit sequence. Once again look at Numbers Station Broadcast evidence and find the corresponding city to your numbers. This is the passphrase you must enter when the computer asks you for it.Important thing to know is that everyone gets a different puzzle, but they usually follow the same math problem pattern. Red numbers usually require you to add a certain number to the previous one to get the whole sequence. Blue number puzzle can be different. You must add or subtract a number, then add/subtract a smaller number for the next number in the sequence and so on. In my case 7 + 8 = 15 15 + 6 = 21 21 + 4 = 25 25 + 2 = 27As you can see the difference between each number descends by two. In the case of your own puzzle the game will show you the difference can be by one or three and it can be descending or ascending. The main point is that you should be looking for a math pattern to get the solution to the puzzle. Also, remember that red numbers and blue numbers always have a different math pattern as a key to the puzzle.TLDR: STEP #1: get code: Look at Front Page of the Observer and write down red letters. Then, inspect Numbers Station Broadcast and rearrange letters against the list of names on the Numbers Station Broadcast, and find the corresponding code. STEP #2: get passphrase: Open A Coded Message and solve the riddle by finding RED and BLUE number. The missing red and blue number will give you a 4 digit number. Open Numbers Station Broadcast again and find corresponding name. Use this name as passphrase. All Evidence To Decrypt Floppy Disk Code 1. Use Numbers Station Broadcast To DecryptUse the numbers and the names listed above to generate the Code and the Passphrase. 2. Use Newspaper For CodeTo get the Code, take the red letters on the newspaper. Then use the letters and rearrange them to get an equivalent 4-digit code using the Numbers Station Broadcast evidence.3. Use Coded Message For PassphraseFor the Passphrase, check the pattern on the Coded Message. In the example above, red numbers increase by 7 and the blue ones with +1, +2, +3.... In fact, one specific puzzle has managed to stump players at a crucial point in the game. Yes, we are referring to the Operation Chaos Floppy Disc code problem that has players absolutely flabbergasted. Fortunately, we've figured out how to decipher the code for you. What you need to do to access the floppy disc There are two things you need to know in order to access the contents of the Operation Chaos Floppy Disc. One is the 4-digit numeric code and the other is the City name passphrase. Without these two elements, you will not be able to decrypt the contents of the disc. How to get the code The general confusion with players is about what the code is and which city represents the passphrase. Keep in mind that you will get the code for the floppy disc from the Coded Newspaper evidence by deciphering the name of the city. You also need to have the Numbers Station Broadcast evidence before we proceed. Follow these steps once you have both the pieces of evidence with you. Separate the red letters in the front-page headline of the Newspaper. Credit: OmegaTV Trying different permutations and combinations of the red letters in the front-page headline to recover the name of the city. In this case, it was TUSCON. Now, open the Number Station Broadcast evidence and match the four numbers against the name of the city you deciphered. Credit: OmegaTV In this case, 8029 is the code for the Floppy Disc. Decrypt the Floppy Disc To decipher the passphrase make sure that you have collected two pieces of evidence in the game. First is the Encoded Message to Qasim and second which you will already have by now, is the Numbers Station Broadcast. Solve the Encoded Message to Qasim: The encoded message will look like a Housie game ticket and one entire row will be marked with numbers that will be colored in blue and red. You need to separate the blue-colored numbers and group them together whilst doing the same thing for the red-colored numbers. Each set will have a missing number that you need to figure out from the sequence of the pre-existing numbers in the set. Credit: OmegaTV Now, keep in mind that these numbers are randomized for different players so there is no one number fits all solution here. Look at the numbers and apply logic. One scenario is if the numbers are in ascending order, then calculate the difference between these numbers and you will arrive at a constant. You need to add that constant to the lower limit number in the order and subtract the constant to the upper limit number in the given order to fill the missing number. For example, suppose the numbers are arranged in this order: 01, 11,21, '?, 41, 51. The constant difference between the numbers is 10, so 21+10= 31 and 41-10= 31, this means the missing number is 31. Now, keep in mind that there are also scenarios where you need to identify the sequence of numbers and there might be no addition or subtraction involved. But don't stress, the answer is fairly obvious once you give it some serious thought. So suppose the code you get is 6217, what you need to do now is co-related these numbers to the city name in the Number Station Broadcast. In this case, the code is co-related to New York.
