The Seattle Kraken's 2023-24 season was marked by a mix of promising performances and disappointing setbacks. The team signed defenseman Ryan Lindgren to a four-year deal worth \$4.5 million per year, despite playing just 18 games last season due to injury. Lindgren's physicality, compete level, and playoff experience make him an attractive addition. The Kraken also signed goalie Matt Murray on a one-year deal worth \$1 million, despite his brief appearance in two games for the Toronto Maple Leafs last season. Botterill believes Murray is healthy and hungry to compete, given his Stanley Cup-winning pedigree. Botterill's focus on bringing depth and competition is crucial with an Olympic year ahead and a condensed schedule. The team will need to utilize their depth to succeed, especially against opponents like 7th place Pacific rivals. The Kraken are satisfied with the moves made so far, but Botterill emphasizes the need for more size, physicality, and competition. While there are still 14 days left in free agency, the GM appears pleased with the roster's progress.
