The Department of Psychology at UC San Diego emphasizes research in the experimental and theoretical analysis of human and animal behavior, and the study of the mind. Students specializing in psychology can expect to develop knowledge in a wide range of content areas, as well as basic skills in experimental and analytical procedures. We offer courses in the main areas of experimental psychology, with areas of specialization in clinical psychology, cognitive psychology, developmental psychology, human health psychology, sensations and perceptions, and social psychology; a specialization in psychology and a joint specialization with the Department of Cognitive Sciences, in cognitive and behavioral neuroscience. Students who are interested in studying a specialty in psychology, or who have declared a specialty, are strongly advised to consult with the Office of Psychology Student Affairs to make sure that the main requirements are fully understood. Degrees offered include: Students who specialize in psychology must have the approval to study a specialty in psychology. 3n departmental for elective subjects taken outside the department. We recommend consulting the Department of Psychology before enrolling in courses offered by other departments. It is recommended that all students seek additional advice from faculty and advisory staff to determine if an additional course in maths, programming, physical or biological sciences, philosophy or any other discipline may be valuable given the specific academic or professional objectives of students after graduation. Experimental psychology uses scientific tools and concepts: knowledge of formal systems such as logic or calculus, probability theory, computer science, chemistry, biological, physical and statistical. statistics. Students in superior division courses must have an appropriate background on these topics. Prerequisites for individual courses are specified in the catalog. The lower division courses for the specialty must be completed at the end of the Sophomore year.
