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## How to start crochet beginners

(Does not count as a stitch.) Starting in the first stitch, make one single crochet (sc) in each stitch. Here are all of our crochet patterns broken down by the weight of yarn that they use: There are many different types of yarn, each made of a different fiber. Repeat these steps until you get to the end of the chained row. Some yarns are 100% acrylic, wool, or cotton, while some are blends of each. There will be two loops on the hook. The half-double crochet stitch, abbreviated HDC, is another one of the 6 basic crochet stitches. Yarn over again and pull through the last two loops on the hook. Single crochet stitches are one of the first beginner crochet projects you make! This first project usually consists of rows and rows of single crochet stitches to make a scarf, washcloth, or even a blanket you are feeling adventurous. Smooth texture. Step 1: Chose your yarn Step 2: Chose the hook that corresponds to the yarn (that can be found on th yarn label) Step 3: Hold the hook in your dominant hand (left hand or right hand), Make a slip-knot and chain 10 (or whatever amount you'd like) Step 4: In the second chain stitch from the hook Step 5: Wrap the yarn over the hook, and pull it back through the chain. Remember, practice makes perfect! Crocheting may take a little patience at first, but with practice, you'll become more comfortable with the stitches and be able to tackle more complex patterns. Pencil Grip: Use your thumb and index finger to pinch or hold the grip of the hook (see illustration above) like you would a pencil. One of the first things you need to do once you get all the tools of the trade, is to understand how crochet patterns are written, and how you must read them. It's also a good idea to always turn your work in the same way - either clockwise or counterclockwise. Depending on the type of stitch, you'll make the first stitch of the row into the second, third, or fourth chain from the hook. I'll be writing the directions from the perspective of a right-handed person - but lefties can reverse the directions to learn how to do left-handed crochet. It is a method of creating a looped fabric from yarn with a crochet hook. Crochet abbreviations are a way to shorten a crochet stitch's name or certain crochet actions inside crochet patterns. For example, wool that should be used on a sweater should not be used to make a blanket. Once you learn the basic technique, you can add even more yarn-overs to make double-treble and triple-treble stitches. The different parts of a crochet hook are listed in this image and include the point, throat, grip, shaft, and handle. Some of my favorite yarns to teach with are Bernat Maker Home Dec and Swish Worsted from WeCrochet.com Crochet hooks come in a range of sizes, shapes, and materials. Slip stitch is a very useful and versatile technique. Use your third finger underneath for more balance and control. Just make 2 or more stitches in the same stitch. Not too tight, there should be some give. Most crochet patterns feature an extensive use of abbreviations, and all have a common outline. Explore the different crochet stitches below to expand your crochet skills and knowledge. Slip stitch is a useful technique that can be used in so many different ways. I prefer to teach the way my nana taught me because it's how all the hooks are published Turn the long side of the thread around your pinkie and twist it around your index finger. Mistakes can be easier to correct. Working into chain stitches is tricky: it's hard to know exactly where to insert your hook, and there isn't much fabric for your other hand to hold. Good thing, too, as it's used as the starting point for almost all crochet patterns. In UK patterns, it's called the double treble stitch. A stitch marker is a small tool that is used in crochet and knitting to help keep the place of a stitch while working up a design. A chain stitch, is a simple crochet stitch that often forms the foundation of what crochet stitches are worked into during most crochet projects. As you work, move your left-hand fingers up along the chain. Crochet has been around for centuries and is still one of the most popular yarn crafts today. Hang on to tail and pull the loop tight.Pick up the loop in your left hand and slide the hook into the loop and tighten the loop around the hook. Yarn comes in many different weights: from super-fine baby-weight yarn all the way up to bulky-weight wool. Keep making more rows of single crochet until you've reached your desired length. How to do single crochet: If you are starting a new crochet swatch, make a slip knot and a beginning chain (foundation row). To make a slip knot: Pull a length of yarn from the ball. But for beginners, I recommend using medium-weight (number four) acrylic, wool, or cotton yarn. A double crochet stitch is taller than a single crochet stitch and a half-double stitch but shorter than a treble crochet stitch. You can use half-double crochet to make a variety of projects, including baby blankets, pillows, scarves, and warm sweaters. Slip stitch is the shortest of the basic crochet stitches. I like to keep my hook in the stitch as I turn the work so that I don't lose my place. Use the hook to grab the ball-end yarn, and pull it through the center of the loop. Various Crochet Hook Sizes Easy Crochet has conveniently classified all our patterns into which hook size is used. It also can use a magic circle aka magic ring to start the square, so it has a seamless circle to start the project with. Note: Some patterns will ask you to turn the chain over and make the first row of stitches into the back bar only. Expert Tip: Make sure the gauge is followed for a perfectly shaped project. The turning chain number will depend on what crochet stitch you are using. You can also use a slip stitch to join a round of crochet into a circle by connecting the last stitch to the first stitch of that same round. It's easier to see your stitches when you use a ball of simple, smooth wool or acrylic yarn. You can buy yarn online or in-store, but I always prefer to buy it online. The treble crochet stitch is the tallest stitch on our list of the six basic crochet stitches. Tapestry needle: These will help you to weave in all the loose yarn ends at the end of your project. You'll work the first row of crochet stitches into this foundation chain. In the skills to know section, there is a better explanation of these terms. Bring the working yarn over the hook from back to front (aka "yarn over"). Let's continue. The second way to hold yarn is to hold it between the index finger and middle finger as you are working. There are different ways to hold the hook, but the most important thing is to choose one that works best for you. (10 stitches)Continue making additional rows as desired. Repeat steps two and three for the next stitches until you have the desired number of stitches for a pattern. You have completed your first single crochet stitch. Next, flip the whole thing down, onto the longer yarn. The stitches and techniques below will be shown in American Crochet Terms (or US Standard terms). With all the different types of yarns and hooks, the selections can be a bit overwhelming. It is important to familiarize yourself with the hook so when you pick up a hook for the first time, you will understand it and its parts before starting crochet and beginning your first pattern. The first way is to wind the yarn around your little finger, under the two middle fingers and over your index finger of your left hand, starting with the yarn tail end of the yarn. Double crochet is one of the taller stitches on our list. Use larger crochet hooks with thicker yarns and smaller crochet hooks with thinner yarns. There is a front loop and back loop of every chain (or stitch) that resembles a V. In a similar way, lemon peel stitch is made from an alternating pattern of single and double crochet stitches. One single crochet stitch after another creates a tighter crochet fabric in projects and is the perfect stitch for beginners for easy crocheting. The first step is to gather your favorite crochet supplies. After you've mastered the single crochet stitch, add more crochet stitches to your repertoire. To create more tension on the yarn, you can loop the yarn once around the pinkie before passing it under the third and middle fingers and over the index finger. Double crochet fabric is a little more open and flexible than fabric made from plain single crochet. You can also use slip stitch to join a round of crochet into a circle, connecting the last stitch of the round to the first stitch of that same round. To fasten off: Cut the yarn, leaving a 6-inch yarn tail. The single crochet stitch is the next crochet stitch that beginners should learn. The first chain stitch is complete. These easy crochet stitches are a good foundation for improving crochet skills as a new crocheter. Anatomy of a Crochet Hook There are over thirty different sizes of crochet hooks, and crochet patterns will usually require a specific hook size. The number of chains across in a crochet pattern can determine the length or the width of a crochet project. Ready to learn more crochet? Sounds simple, right? Hold the hook in your right hand. To hold the yarn, loop the yarn through the fingers of your non-dominant hand. The most common, however, is anywhere between a 3 mm and 15 mm size. Yarn thickness is used to determine the weight of the yarn, which can be categorized into numerical weights of 0 to 7. Other fun stitch patterns include shell stitch and corner-to-corner crochet. Yarn over and pull up a loop. The weight of the yarn will also determine what size crochet hook you will use, too! To make it easy, most yarn companies include all this information on the yarn label of each skein of yarn. If I can recommend nothing else, please remember that getting your gauge right is significant! If you get more stitches than the pattern's gauge, that means your crochet is too tight. If you get fewer stitches than the pattern, your crochet is too loose. Scissors: A great pair of stork scissors will get the job done, and these should be considered your crochet only scissors, so don't let anyone else use them for anything else. Use your left-hand index finger to wrap the yarn over the crochet hook, or use your right hand to pivot the hook onto the yarn. Here is how to make a DC stitch: Yarn over, an insert the hook into the next stitch. Yarn over and pull up a new loop. The guides above are all great tools to help learn how to crochet. Then, insert the hook into the second chain from the hook. The slip knot is complete, and you are ready to start crocheting.
